## Mass Schedule Change

Beginning on August 28, daily Mass on Wednesdays will move from 12:05 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., followed by confessions, beginning at approximately 7:30 p.m. (Mass on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays will continue to be celebrated at 12:05 p.m. Confessions will also continue to be heard on Saturdays at 4:00 p.m.)

The reason for this change is to make daily Mass and the Sacrament of Penance more available to both VCU students and Cathedral parishioners. I realize that this change in schedule may be inconvenient for some. For those who can only attend daily Mass at midday, there is a Mass nearby at St. Peter's Church at 12:05 p.m. Thank you for understanding. CCM Adoration, to which Cathedral parishioners are invited, will now move to Tuesdays (7:00–8:00 p.m.) when classes are in session.

**Sung Preface**

The singing of the Preface to the Eucharistic Prayer, including its opening dialogue (“Lift up your hearts...”), is esteemed and recommended: “Great importance should... be attached to the use of singing in the celebration of the Mass... Every care should be taken that singing by the ministers and the people not be absent in celebrations that occur on Sundays and on Holydays of Obligation. ...In the choosing of the parts actually to be sung, preference is to be given to those that are of greater importance and especially to those which are to be sung by the Priest or the Deacon or a reader, with the people replying, or by the Priest and people together” (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, no. 40).

The Preface, which varies from Sunday to Sunday and from feast to feast, is an expression of thanks to God and constitutes the introduction to the Eucharistic Prayer, “the center and high point of the entire celebration” (no. 78; see also no. 79).

Singing the texts of the Mass itself (for example, the Preface) is a deeper form of prayer. According to Vatican Council II, “Sacred music is to be considered the more holy in proportion as it is more closely connected with the liturgical action, whether it adds delight to prayer, fosters unity of minds, or confers greater solemnity upon the sacred rites” (Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, Sacrosanctum Concilium, no. 112). The great St. Augustine of Hippo (354–430 AD) put it eloquently: “Singing is for the one who loves.”
