

"Is it not I, Your Mother, Who is Here?": A Holy Hour in Commemoration of Our Lady of Guadalupe Tuesday, December 12 | 6:00 p.m.

Each month, a holy hour takes place that includes exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, Scripture, sacred music, silent prayer, and benediction. The holy hour is a way to deepen one's love and appreciation for the Eucharist, which is Christ himself.

This month's holy hour will focus on Our Lady of Guadalupe, whose feast day is observed on December 12. On the outskirts of Mexico City in 1531, the Virgin Mary appeared to St. Juan Diego (1474–1548), saying to him, "Do not let your heart be troubled, and let nothing upset you. Is it not I, your Mother, who is here?"

Financial Update: Christmas Wish

The Cathedral has withdrawn \$117,000 from its endowment fund to pay for normal operating expenses. Even with this withdrawal, the parish is projected to have a cash shortfall of \$43,000 by the end of the fiscal year (June 30, 2024). The current situation reflects the trend of falling offertory income over the past five years (since 2018), compounded by rising prices. During the Christmas season, parishioners are kindly asked to consider increasing their offertory contributions to help cover this deficit, as expenses have already been significantly reduced.

Notes from the Choir Loft: Sunday's Motet

"E'en So, Lord Jesus, Quickly Come" (Cf. Rev 22), written by Paul Manz (1919–2009) and published in 1954, has been performed around the world and recorded hundreds of times. Selling well over one million copies, the piece was written as a lamentation for the composer's son, who was stricken with a rare, crippling double pneumonia. The opening motif for the composition simultaneously expresses hope and grief, while the text prays for the immediate presence of Christ to dispel the dark of doubt and night. (The son recovered, and this motet was dedicated to him.)

Foundation Organ Campaign: Turning "Pipe" Dreams Into Reality

The Cathedral's third and final organ is on track for delivery on Monday, April 1, 2024. In addition to the choir and continuo organs hand crafted by the same firm, the gallery instrument will be the magnum opus of Juget-Sinclair Organ Builders of Montréal, Quebec, Canada. Like many ancient cathedrals and churches, the Cathedral of the Sacred Heart will house multiple organs operating in consort for the praise and worship of God.

Loving Mother of the Redeemer

There are five antiphons sung in honor of the Blessed Virgin Mary that correspond to the various liturgical seasons. The antiphon sung during Advent and Christmas, until the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord (February 2), is the *Alma Redemptoris Mater* (Loving Mother of the Redeemer). Parishioners may wish to use this antiphon as devotional prayer during Advent:

Loving Mother of the Redeemer, gate of heaven, star of the sea, assist your people who have fallen yet strive to rise again. To the wonderment of nature you bore your Creator, yet remained a virgin after as before. You who received Gabriel's joyful greeting, have pity on us poor sinners.

Dear Cathedral Parishioners,

Happy Advent. I am writing to thank you for your financial support and to ask you to consider further assistance.

You may have read in the bulletin that, last month, the Cathedral withdrew \$117,000 from its endowment fund to pay for normal operating expenses. I made this decision upon the recommendation of the parish finance council and in agreement with it.

Even with this withdrawal, the parish is projected to have a cash shortfall of \$43,000 by the end of the fiscal year (June 30, 2024). The current situation is the result of falling offertory income over the past five years (since 2018), compounded by rising prices owing to inflation.

The parish's operating expenses cover essential items such as staff payroll, utilities, insurance, social events, and various programs and activities. These costs reflect the parish's mission of teaching the Catholic faith, celebrating the sacraments, and fostering community. In this regard, the Cathedral can be proud of its vibrant catechumenate (the process for entering the Catholic Church: Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults or RCIA), solid religious education, robust campus ministry, and dynamic engagement of young adults.

The Cathedral's operating expenses have already been significantly reduced (by 40 percent, beginning in 2019). These costs are separate from other projects such as the rectory renovation, the financing of the new pipe organs, and charitable outreach.

I kindly ask you to consider increasing your offertory contribution to help cover the Cathedral's deficit. If you can contribute more, please do. If you can't, please don't. Contributions can be made by check or online (https://secure.myvanco.com/L-ZABM/campaign/C-ZRYR).

Please know that I am grateful for your prayers and support. I wish you a merry Christmas and a happy new year.
