The Cathedral spends over \$36,000 each year to keep electricity flowing through the building. That breaks down to roughly \$4.00 an hour to maintain this historical edifice. Congratulations to Graham Joseph McCarthy, who was baptized last Saturday.

This first sacrament is the foundation of being a Christian. Baptism, according to the literal meaning of the term, is an "immersion" into the death and resurrection of Christ that shapes all of life: it forgives sins, it makes one son or daughter of God, and it joins one to the Church (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, nos. 1213–1214, 1262–1263, 1265, 1267).

St Jude: the Most Popular Saint in Mexico

WORSHIP

"The Church's Preaching Shines Everywhere": A Holy Hour in Commemoration of St. Mark April 8 | 6:00-7:00 pm

Each month, a holy hour takes place that includes Exposition of the Most Holy Eucharist, Scripture readings, sacred music, silent prayer, and benediction. The holy hour is a way to deepen one's love and appreciation for the Eucharist, which is Christ himself.

The April holy hour will focus on St. Mark the Evangelist, whose feast day is celebrated this month (April 25). St. Mark was a colleague of both St. Peter and St. Paul. According to tradition, he was the author of the Gospel that bears his name and the first bishop of Alexandria (Egypt). He is symbolically depicted as a winged lion (note his image beneath the Cathedral dome).

The life and ministry of St. Mark exemplify the principle enunciated by St. Irenaeus of Lyons (ca. 130-202 AD), whose treatise is read on St. Mark's feast day: "Just as God's creature, the sun, is one and the same the world over, so also does the Church's preaching shine everywhere to enlighten all men who want to come to a knowledge of the truth."

Passiontide

Today, the Fifth Sunday of Lent, the Church enters a two-week period informally known as Passiontide, which lasts through Holy Saturday (April 19). During this time, the readings and prayers of Mass turn toward the Passion of the Lord.

Notes from the Choir Loft

Ave Verum Corpus (published in 1605) remains one of composer William Byrd's (ca. 1540-1623) beloved pieces. The piece crystallizes Byrd's uniqueness: perfectly controlled writing, clear structure, the unexpected, fervor, and a gripping conviction characteristic of a Catholic recusant in Protestant England.

Cathedral Foundation Organ Campaign Turning "Pipe" Dreams Into Reality

Last week on Lætare Sunday, the new organ featured an unusual stop: the rossignol (French: nightingale). Along with rose-colored vesture and more activity from the organ, the rossignol signaled the midpoint of the Lenten journey and more spring-like weather. The effect of singing birds is achieved by immersing four pipes in three inches of water.

Jubilee 2025

Pilgrims of Hope

"We should indeed prepare ourselves consciously and soberly for the moment when our lives will be judged, but we must always do this from the standpoint of hope, the theological virtue that sustains our lives and shields them from groundless fear. The judgment of God, who is love (cf. 1 Jn 4:8, 16), will surely be based on love, and in particular on all that we have done or failed to do with regard to those in need, in whose midst Christ, the Judge himself, is present (cf. Mt 25:31–46). ...In the words of Benedict XVI: 'At the moment of judgment we experience and we absorb the overwhelming power of his love over all the evil in the world and in ourselves. The pain of love becomes our salvation and our joy'" (Bull of Indiction of the Jubilee Year, *Spes non confundit*, no. 22 §1).

The Jubilee Cross will remain in the sanctuary throughout the year so that the faithful can venerate it. Parishioners are encouraged to pray the Jubilee prayer that has been placed near the Cross.

Abstinence during Lent

Catholic ages 14 and older are obliged to abstain from eating meat on the Fridays of Lent (*Code of Canon Law*, canons 1251–1252). Expectant and nursing mothers, and those who are ill, are dispensed from the obligation of abstinence.

Marriage in the Church

"Since marriage establishes the couple in a public state of life in the Church, it is fitting that its celebration be public, in the framework of a liturgical celebration, before the priest (or a witness authorized by the Church), the witnesses, and the assembly of the faithful" (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, no. 1663).

In order for a Catholic to be validly married, he or she must normally be married in the Church; that is, in the presence of a priest or deacon (*Code of Canon Law*, canon 1108 §1). Being married in the Church does not require that a Catholic's spouse be or become a Catholic.
